# DOMESTIC SECTION

- 1. Pot of Jam.
  - 2. Pot of any other preserve.
- 3. 4 Cheese Scones.
- 4. Jam Swiss Roll.
  5. \(\frac{1}{4}\) lb. Chocolate Fudge.
  - 6. Fruit Cake to given recipe below.
- 12 ozs. Mixed Fruit. 4 ozs. Butter or margarine. 8 ozs. S.R. Flour. 4 ozs. Sugar.  $\frac{1}{4}$  pint Water.
- Place fruit, sugar, margarine or butter and water in pan, simmer slowly for 20 minutes.
- 2. Allow to cool, then add beaten egg and stir in flour.
- 3. Turn into a greased 6 or 7 inch tin.
- 4. Bake in very moderate oven (300-325°F, gas mark 2-3) about 1½ hours.
