3. Any objection raised as to the qualifications of an exhibitor shall be dealt with by the Committee and its decision shall be final.
4. ALL EXHIBITS must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least TWO MONTHS, except the Domestic Section and where stated.
5. ALL ENTRIES should be sent to the Show Secretary with Members' names and classes entered on a sheet of paper with entrance money not later than THURSDAY, 10th AUGUST, 1989.
Entries will be accepted up until 11 a.m. on the day of the Show but
ENTRY FEES WILL BE DOUBLE.
6. Members' entry fees will be 5p for all classes.
Non Members' entry fees will be 10p for all classes.
Membership subscription £1 due at the Annual General Meeting.
If not paid by 30th JUNE, 1989, does not qualify as a Member.
7. The Hall will be open from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. and NO entries will be accepted after this time.
8. One entry per person in any one class.
9. Exhibits are not to be removed from the tables before the prizegiving.
10. The Committee will not be held responsible for any damage that may occur to the exhibits.
11. All Cups - winner to hold trophy for ELEVEN MONTHS.
All Cups must be returned to the SHOW SECRETARY one month before the Show.

GYPSY TART RECIPE

Bake a pastry case and leave to cool.

Place 6 ozs. evaporated milk into a basin. Whisk by hand or electric until very thick and creamy.

Then sieve 8 ozs. soft brown sugar into bowl with milk and whisk again until well mixed.

Place mixture into pastry case and place in oven set at 375°F for approximately 5 minutes or until skin has formed on top.

Leave to cool.
