METHOD: Grease a 7 inch square cake tin and line base with greased greaseproof paper. Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Gradually beat in the eggs. Sieve in all but one tablespoon of flour and fold into the mix. Divide the mixture in half. Fold the vanilla essence and remaining flour into one half and the cocoa into the other. Put spoonfuls of mixture alternately in the tin. Bake in a moderate oven for 1 hour at 180°C/350°F, Gas Mark 4 until well risen and golden brown. Leave in the tin for 5 minutes, then turn out on wire rack to cool. Cream butter and beat in icing sugar. Dissolve the cocoa in the water and beat into creamed mixture. Spread the butter icing over the top of the cake and leave to set.
