2. Any objection raised as to the qualifications of an exhibitor shall be dealt with by the Committee and its decision shall be final.
3. ALL EXHIBITS must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least TWO MONTHS, except the Domestic Section and where stated.
4. ALL ENTRIES should be sent to the Show Secretary with Members' names and classes entered on a sheet of paper with entrance money not later than THURSDAY, 25th JULY, 1991

Entries will be accepted up until 11 a.m. on the day of the Show but ENTRY FEES WILL BE DOUBLE. Please Note if the exhibit entries are changed on the day of the Show, the ENTRY FEE WILL BE DOUBLED.

5. Members' entry fees will be 5p for all classes.
Non Members' entry fees will be 10p for all classes.
MEMBERSHIP SUBSCRIPTION (£1) due at the Annual General Meeting.
Please Note: If not paid by 30th JUNE, 1991, does not qualify as a Member.
6. The Hall will be open from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. and NO entries will be accepted after this time.
7. One entry per person in any one class.
8. Exhibits are not to be removed from the tables before the prizegiving.
9. The Committee will not be held responsible for any damage that may occur to the exhibits.
10. All cups - winner to hold trophy for ELEVEN MONTHS
All cups must be returned to the SHOW SECRETARY ONE MONTH before the Show

100g/4oz Butter.	2 Beaten eggs.
150g/6oz Caster Sugar.	150g/6oz Self-Raising Flour.
Grated rind and juice 2 lemons.	50g/2oz Granulated Sugar.
A little milk.	

* * * * *

1. Cream butter, caster sugar and lemon rind until fluffy.
2. Gradually beat in eggs.
3. Mix in flour and add about 4 tablespoons of milk to soften mixture.
4. Grease a 1kg/2lb loaf tin.
5. Bake in a moderate oven Gas 4, 350°F, 180°C for 45-50 minutes until well risen and golden, firm on top and shrinking from sides of tin.
6. Just before cake is ready, prepare the lemon syrup. Heat lemon juice and granulated sugar gently until sugar is dissolved.
7. Take cake out of oven, while still in tin, pierce top all over with skewer. Pour over the lemon syrup. Leave cake in tin until cold.
