3. ALL EXHIBITS must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least TWO MONTHS, except the Domestic Section and where stated.
4. ALL ENTRIES should be sent to the Show Secretary with Members' names and classes entered on a sheet of paper with entrance money not later than THURSDAY, 30th JULY, 1992

Entries will be accepted up until 11 a.m. on the day of the Show but
ENTRY FEES WILL BE DOUBLE.

Please Note: If the exhibit entries are changed on the day of the Show,
the ENTRY FEE WILL BE DOUBLED.

5. Members' entry fees will be 10p for all classes.
Non Members' entry fees will be 20p for all classes.

RECIPE FOR BREAD PUDDING

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|--------------------------------|--------------------------|
| 8 oz. Stale Bread (cubed) | $\frac{3}{4}$ pint Milk. |
| 2 oz. Butter. | 2 oz. Demerara Sugar. |
| 2 oz. Sultanas. | 2 oz. Currants. |
| 1 teaspoon Ground Ginger. | 1 teaspoon Cinnamon. |
| $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon Nutmeg. | 2 Eggs beaten. |
| Demerara Sugar for sprinkling. | |

Place bread in a mixing bowl. Bring milk, butter and sugar to the boil. Pour over bread, mix well and leave to soak for 15 minutes. Add remaining ingredients and beat well until evenly mixed. Spoon into a buttered dish 11" x 7" and bake for 45 minutes on 180°C or 350°F or Gas Mark 4 until golden and firm. Sprinkle with demerara sugar.
